
TRIO SSS Spring 2024 Semester Review Here's what has happened in the last semester and what's to come!

Campus Visits


This past semester we took students to both the University of Minnesota Twin Cities and Augsburg!

After graduating Normandale Alina went on to the University of Minnesota Twin Cities, where she decided to follow her passion and switched gears towards biology and plant science.

"My journey was never a straightforward one, but following my passions I ended up where I needed to be. "

After graduating she completed an internship with a plant biotech company and returned to get her Masters of Science in Applied Plant Science, with a specific focus on plant breeding and molecular genetics. Alina is currently mapping a gene in the soybean plant that can change how many seeds it can produce in a pod.

Alina had great advice for our current students, telling them to seek out mentorship


"Imagine you are in a dark room and you have a little tiny flashlight. This room represents your field: be it dentistry, computer sci, engineering or something else. You are trying to see what's in the room but your view is very limited....Being paired with a mentor is like having someone come in with a giant flashlight that can illuminate half the room at a time and on top of that your mentor can point the flashlight to parts of the room you didn't even know existed! "

Aline plans to pursue her PhD next, although she is undecide on where this next journey will take her, we know she will do amazing this and we are proud to have her as Normandale TRIO alum!





Current Student Profile: Alex Elbaz



I attended Normandale because it was in such a convenient location for me. That and with the phenomenal reputation they have with support, affordability, and transfer pathway options, were all the reasons why I began by college journey at Normandale. It's even truly remarkable to see how Normandale went from a simple community college to becoming a part of the MN State System and becoming the 2nd largest college in Minnesota.

I've been a student here since the beginning of 2023, and there was never any doubt in my mind that Normandale was the right fit for me, and I got to start a new chapter in my life because of them.



How did you learn about TRIO? I learned about TRIO through Normandale's Office for Students With Disabilities. I was already with OSD as I have a mild form of Autism and a Stutter or a Speech-Language Impairment. They told me about how TRIO supports students who come from more disadvantaged backgrounds and provide other things such as additional scholarship opportunities, touring other colleges/universities, and engaging in other fun activities. I thought joining TRIO would be good for me being that I did come from a very disadvantaged background, and want to get all the support possible so I can thrive inside and outside the classroom as well as planning for my future.

How would you describe TRIO to other students?

I would describe TRIO as a program that assists students who are either first-generation college students, come from a low-income background, or have a disability. I for one am in TRIO for all three of those things. They are another great source of support for things such as academic advising, financial aid, assistance with resumes, and so on. TRIO is another great way to build community with other students who share similar backgrounds. I love TRIO and I don't think I would be as successful as I am today without their support and guidance. TRIO is a prime example of the message I try to send to everyone is that for anyone who is considering attending Normandale no matter who you are or where you're at in life, everyone believes in you and I believe in you





What is your favorite thing about being a Normandale student?

My favorite thing about being a Normandale student is that they truly are all about caring, curiosity, and commitment. I definitely know what it's like to face adversity with some of the hardships I've endured, but it wasn't until I came to Normandale that I truly felt like I had a place somewhere, and I was celebrated, not tolerated. Because I was welcomed with such open arms, I wanted to give back to the rest of the Normandale community by becoming one of its Student Ambassadors. I'm the face of the school, that first point of contact, and I make sure I'm positively representing the college. I love my role and it has made me more fulfilled than ever! I even once spoke from the heart about my experience at Normandale on a Student Panel for a Staff development in the Fall 2023 Semester, which left a powerfully positive impact on everyone. Ever since the panel, all the faculty/staff have been just as compelled as ever to keep doing what they're doing. I still get compliments about it to this very day! The biggest thing with all of that was that it was only the beginning for me. I have a whole other year at Normandale left before I graduate, and if I can leave such an impact early on my higher education journey, I can do that just about anywhere. When I have a positive experience, I don't just keep it to myself, I try to find ways to give that energy back to others so they have something to be inspired by.

What are you studying / your future plans?

I'm currently majoring in Communications here at Normandale for my undergraduate program. I plan to graduate with an Associate of Arts Degree in Communications by the Spring 2025 Semester. Afterwards, I plan to get a Bachelor's degree most likely either at the University of Minnesota Twin Cities in Journalism or Augsburg University for Communications. I even have other Universities in Mind such as Minnesota State University Mankato and Metropolitan State University for my Bachelor's and if I ever choose to pursue a Master's Degree. Writing has always been something I've been passionate about and has had positive feedback from anyone I've shared it with. I found my writing to be at its peak when I'm critically thinking and analyzing something as opposed to being a creative writer, and that's why I think Journalism is the perfect fit for me!
